

Increase acres of grassland habitat managed annually on 3 core state properties










Increase Woody Removal & Control

- 1600 acres/year
- 10-Year Goal:
 <20% of properties with trees/shrubs >6 ft tall






Private Lands Initiatives

- 5. Tree/brush removal roads/fences


















